Re: Approval of Addendum to General Site Plan Version 2011-05 for Operations Phase Waste Rock Stockpile

Pursuant to section 6.2 of Quartz Mining License QML-0006 (the "License") for the Wolverine Project, designs for the construction of an operations phase waste rock stockpile have been submitted as an addendum to the currently approved General Site Plan Version 2011-05. In reviewing your request I considered the following two documents, which were received electronically in my office on October 17th, 2011:

- Letter from Mary Mioska to Robert Holmes; dated October 17th, 2011, entitled *Addendum to General Site Plan V20011-05 for Operations Phase Waste Rock Stockpile*; and
- Letter/report from Klohn Crippen Berger to Don Strickland, Mine General Manager, Wolverine Mine; dated October 13, 2011; entitled *Wolverine Mine, Waste Rock Storage Pad* (the "Design Report").

After review and consideration of the above two documents, I have determined that the Design Report is approved and will hereby form an addendum to General Site Plan Version 2011-05. This approval is subject to the following conditions pertaining to this approved waste rock storage pad:

1. Only waste rock from the underground operations may be deposited on the pad, to a maximum of 325,000 tonnes; and
2. The location and footprint of the pad must be as shown on the drawing entitled "Waste Rock Storage Area General Arrangement - Plan", included in the Design Report.

I wish to remind you that as per section 6.5 of the License, Yukon Zinc Corporation must implement and undertake all activities in accordance with the details described in this addendum.

For greater certainty, in reviewing and approving the submitted designs, I have relied upon the seal of the engineer who prepared the designs and neither I nor the Yukon Government makes any representations or warranties as to the sufficiency or adequacy of these designs. Further you are reminded that the approval of the Chief pertains only to the Chief's responsibilities under the *Quartz Mining Act* and that all work undertaken in relation to the General Site Plan must comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act and related regulations.

Please be reminded that, as per section 7.8 of the License, as-built drawings and a summary of construction activities, including any quality assurance or quality control monitoring must be submitted within 60 days of construction completion.
